

- Registration
- Working Visa

- Desirable to have job set up before you leave

Registration

- Eligible w/ degree from UCD
- Certify docs correctly! details on application form
- Translations degree order from National University of Ireland, 49 Merrion Square, Dublin 2, Ireland

Documentation

- Application form
- Copy of passport (certified from solicitor)
- Degree cert (copy certified)
- Translation of degree (official & original)
- Academic Transcript (original from admin)
- Curriculum (original Physio secretary)
- Bank Draft NZ\$1200
- Letter of good standing from ISCP
- Garda screening not the same as garda clearance doesn't take as long
- 2 letters of professional referees (haven't yet been employed as a physio therefore use clincal tutors – don't need to fill in employment form but they write letter & send directly to board)
- Portfolio:
 - CV
 - Competencies
 - Evidence (incl any assignments, placement details, inservices, thesis all stamped by college)
 - Evidence Based Practice final year project.

- Then apply for an APC : Annual Practising Cert
- If registered in NZ can get easy registration in OZ (in the majority of states)
- Leave time to complete application & allow plenty of time for it to process. Start looking at process now!
- Be sure to certify everything correctly
- Avoid putting in unnecessary docs

VISA's

- 12 month working holiday VISA = apply online, easy
- If want to stay longer then you can apply for a 2 year work to resident visa – need to complete medicals etc – can start on 12 month working visa and then change to this one
- Residency points system & lotto physio previously on long term shortage list so good chance of getting




Working Environment

- Pay per pt worthwhile depending on season and busyness of clinic
- Conversion to NZ dollars good => money you bring over will go further

- Weekly in-services, monthly tutorials
- Senior Support
