Context	Chad, French African country neighboring Nigeria, Cameroun, Libya, North Sudan
ICF Personal factors	Tahir is 9 years old and has been amputated in Sudan because of an untreated. He is living with his family and many siblings in the bush where they are cow breeders. He was first very shy but once used to the rehabilitation staff was very motivated by physiotherapy. He does not go to school because education is inaccessible
ICF Environmental factors	His environment is typical of the desertic African bush, where people move by foot or eventually by horse. He is very well supported by his father who understands the value of prosthetic fitting. He doesn't get any social or community support for medical / rehabilitation except the one provided by the ICRC.
ICF Structure / Function levels	His bilateral lower limbs amputation is on trans-tibial level and the stumps are in a good condition (after surgical stump revision of one leg). On each relevant structure and functions to his condition, Tahir is showing normal status, probably also due to his young age and the good care of his father. Skin integrity, joint mobility, muscle power are normal.
ICF Activities/ Participation levels	Tahir is independent for all activities of daily living (e.g. washing, dressing) as well as fitting his prosthesis. His father is looking after his health. He can lift and carry objects. He walks without crutches without perimeter limits and runs, too. He is playing football. His daily activities consist in taking care of cows, sheeps and goats. Doing housework such as collecting wood, getting water and assisting his elderly siblings. Actually he is very well integrated in his community.
